1ST REGIONAL DEPED ICT SUMMIT 2017

This Region

- The Department of Education (DepEd)-Region X, through the Information and Communications Technology Unit (ICTU), will hold the 1st Regional DepEd ICT Summit on November 20-21, 2017, with the theme Digital Transformation for the KID (K-12 + ALS, ICT, DepEd). The venue will be announced in a separate Memorandum.
- 2. The Summit aims to:
 - a. update ICT practitioners in DepEd on emerging technologies;
 - b. start the culture of sharing and collaborating of ICT in teaching, learning, and governance;
 - c. provide a forum to update everyone on current ICT projects and implementations in DepEd as well as future plans; and
 - d. recognize ICT best projects and implementers.
- The highlight of the Summit will be the Search for the Regional ICT 3. Best Practices, which aims to generate awareness and support from education managers and school communities on ICT initiatives, highlight different DepEd ICT initiatives, support teaching and learning and governance, and cultivate a culture of sustainability among DepEd ICT initiatives across all levels.
- Travel, accommodation, meals, and other expenses relative to the conduct of the Regional Summit shall be charged to the 2017 OSEC-GAS Funds, subject to the accounting and auditing rules and regulations while travel and accommodation expenses of the four (4) representatives per category from each Schools Division shall be charged to local funds, subject to auditing rules and regulations.

- 5. Registration and check-in will be on November 19, 2017, at 2:00 P.M., while check-out is on November 21, 2017, at 12:00 noon. First meal to be served is dinner on November 19 while the last meal is snacks on November 21, 2017.

Search for the Regional ICT Best Practices

Guidelines

Rationale

The Department of Education (DepEd) supports the development of its personnel in order to deliver 21st century learning experiences to the Filipino learners. With its mission to facilitate learning and constantly nurture every learner, DepEd formulates, implements, and coordinates programs and projects in the areas of formal and non-formal basic education. This year, DepEd, through the Information and Communications Technology Services, invites all teaching and non-teaching personnel to the ICT Best Practices Awards.

Tagline

The Summits' tagline is Cultivating a Culture of ICT Excellence.

Objectives

The objectives of the ICT Best Practices Awards are to:

1. generate awareness among and support from education managers and school Communities on ICT initiatives;

2. highlight different DepEd ICT initiatives that support teaching and learning as well as governance; and

3. cultivate a culture of sustainability among DepEd ICT Initiatives across all levels.

Mechanics

- 1. The ICT Best Practices Awards shall be open to all DepEd personnel.
- 2. There shall be five (5) major categories:
 - a. **ICT for Teaching and Learning**. The category highlights the intensification of the use of the DepEd Computerization Program (DCP) packages and other available technologies integrated in the curriculum.
 - b. **ICT for Governance**. The category features ICT ingenuities that further improve DepEd services in the schools, division, and regional levels.
 - c. *ICT for Child Protection*. The category highlights the inventiveness of the use of the DepEd Child Protection Programs to enhance the understanding of the children's use of ICTs and appropriate responses to violence, exploitation, and abuse facilitated through ICTs.

- d. *ICT for Interactive SIMs*. The category features the innovations and quantitative approach in the use of systematized interactive teaching in the schools, division, and regional levels.
- e. *ICT for ICT (Learning Action Cells) LACs Session*. The category highlights the commitment of DepEd to the implementation and development of educational reforms aimed toward the success in the profession in the schools, division, and regional levels.
- 3. The project/innovation/entry shall have been operational and sustainable for, at least, six (6) calendar months from the time of application.
- 4. The contest shall be in two (2) tiers, namely: Division (Tier 1) and Regional (Tier 2).
- a. Each Schools Division shall have one (1) entry for each category. Only the first-place winner in each category shall be the official entry of the Schools Division in the Regional Finals.
- b. The Regional Finals (Tier 2) shall have 14 participating Schools Divisions, each of which shall one (1) official entry per category.
- 5. Each entry shall have only one (1) proponent.
- 6. Proponents are required to prepare a 10-minute video presentation of the entry during the contest proper. The judges shall have five (5) minutes for critiquing.
- 7. Only the first-place winners in the ICT for Teaching and Learning and ICT for Governance shall be the official entry of the Region to the National ICT Summit.
- 8. Regional finalists (Division first-place winners in the five (5) categories) shall display their learning market exhibits alongside the Regional Summit. Presenters shall use a 48x36 inch-size vertical poster layout. Likewise, the poster shall include the division and its logo, school name with logo, proponent's name, entry title, and description of the project in 50-100 words. All other artistic elements of the poster shall be left to the discretion of the proponent.
- 9. Failure to meet the guidelines/mechanics of the contest, including submission of documents that prove the existence and sustainability of the project, shall disqualify the applicants from joining the contest.
- 10. The decision of the board of judges shall be **final**, **non-negotiable**, and **irrevocable**.
- 11. Finally, ICT innovations/projects that have already won in the international, national, and local ICT competitions shall still be eligible to join the contest.
