

#### RESEARCH DESIGN

This tracer study will employ a Mixed-Methods Concurrent Triangulation Strategy as advocated by Creswell and Clark (2007), Johnson and Christensen (2004), Johnson and Onwuegbuzie (2004) such that the study may answer a broader and more comprehensive range of questions. Likewise, by integrating qualitative and quantitative approaches researchers circumvent the disadvantages and utilize the advantages of each approach. Utilizing both quantitative and qualitative approach can improve insights into and understanding of the data, which might be missed when using a single approach.

The quantitative phase of this research will be done through the conduct of the survey among randomly selected Senior High School students. The quantitative phase will be done through the conduct of focus groups whose respondents will be chosen from those chosen for the survey.

#### SAMPLING FRAMEWORK

The population size used in this tracer study is 646,857. This is derived from the total number of Senior High School graduates from the public schools (EMIS DepEd End-of-school-year report, 2018). The



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sample size of 2393 respondents of SHS graduates was computed using a margin of error of 2%, confidence level of 95%, and a response distribution of 50%:

$$n = \frac{N}{1 + Ne2}$$

Where

n = sample size

N = population size (646,857)

e = margin of error (2%)

The margin of error (also known as the confidence interval) measures the precision with which an estimate from a single sample approximates the population value. For instance, in a national voting survey the margin of error might be + or -3%. This means that if 60% of the people in a sample favor Juan dela Cruz, you could confident that, if you surveyed the entire population, between 57% (60-3) and 63% (60+3) of the population would favor Juan dela Cruz. The margin of error in social science research generally ranges from 3% to 10% and is closely related to sample size (Kotrlik, et al., 2001; Suresh & Chandrashekara, 2012). A margin of error will get narrower as the sample size increases. The margin of error selected depends on the precision needed to make population estimates from a sample. This tracer study made use of a 2% margin of error, which already far beyond the ordinary practice and yields a greater sample size. The use of 1% margin of error is ordinarily observed in medical science research.

Prior to sampling, the whole country was stratified to four areas, namely: (1) Luzon, (2) Visayas, (3) Mindanao, and (4) National Capital Region island group. Proportionate stratification was used to determine the number of respondents per major area. With proportionate stratification, the sample size of each stratum (i.e., major area) is proportionate to the population size of the stratum. This means that each stratum has the same sampling fraction. Thus, the distribution of SHS graduates/respondents is proportional to the number of graduates in the major area (Table 1).

From each of the island groups, a simple random sample of six divisions, one division from each socio-economic cluster (i.e., districts 1 to 6). From each division, two schools were random selected. Respondents from each school was computed using proportionate stratification. Thus, the



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distribution of respondents per school is proportional to the number of graduates from the division (Table 2).
