**CONCEPT NOTE**

**I. Background**

The International Cooperation Office (ICO) is anchored on the goal of enhancing the institutional capacity of the Department of Education in developing, coordinating, managing, and consequently, fulfilling international commitments of the country. The office is also mandated to serve as the clearing house for all international transactions within the Department of Education and to strengthen the ties of the Department to its international partners, including bilateral and multilateral cooperation.

The months of May and June have been packed with United Nations celebration that promotes awareness on family, culture, and environment. These three are taking important roles in society in particular in the field of education.

On May 21, **the 2022 World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development** was celebrated to raise public awareness of the value and importance of cultural diversity, and, in particular, to encourage, through education and the media, knowledge of the positive value of cultural diversity. It also invites all member states to strengthen international cooperation and solidarity in supporting national efforts of developing countries to receive help in mastering information technologies with a view to encouraging the production, safeguarding and dissemination of diversified contents in the media and global information networks, and, to that end, to promote the role of public radio and television services in the development of audio-visual productions of good quality, in particular by fostering the establishment of cooperative mechanisms to facilitate their distribution.

By virtue of the UN General Assembly resolution 66/292, the UN member states celebrate **Global Day of Parents** every June 1, in partnership with civil society, particularly young people and children. Families remain at the center of social life, ensuring the well-being of their members, educating and socializing children and youth and caring for the young and old. In particular, family-oriented policies can contribute to the achievement of Sustainable Development Goals relating to doing away with

poverty and hunger; ensuring healthy lives and promoting of well-being for all ages; ensuring educational opportunities throughout the lifespan and achieving gender equality. Emphasizing the critical role of parents in the rearing of children, the Global Day of Parents recognizes that the family has the primary responsibility for the nurturing and protection of children. For the full and harmonious development of their personality, children should grow up in a family environment and in an atmosphere of happiness, love and understanding.

The United Nations designated 5 June as **World Environment Day** to highlight that the protection and health of the environment is a major issue, which affects the well-being of people and economic development throughout the world. The celebration of this day provides us with an opportunity to broaden the basis for an enlightened opinion and responsible conduct by individuals, enterprises and communities in preserving and enhancing the environment.

To celebrate these United Nations international activities and declarations, the Department of Education (DepEd) – International Cooperation Office (ICO) in coordination with the United Nations Association of the Philippines (UNAP) and other education stakeholders and partner agencies will be holding an online activity entitled, **Fostering Education within Family, Culture, and Environment**. It will be a discussion of UN advocates and professionals on fostering education within the family, culture, and in the environment.


