





- 1. The Department of Education (DepEd) Region X Northern Mindanao, through the Education Support Services Division (ESSD) Learner Rights and Protection Office (LRPO), is steadfast in its unwavering commitment and dedication toward ensuring the safety, well-being, and rights of children in all circumstances.
- 2. In support of these child's rights and protection advocacies, the **2023 Learners TeleSafe Contact Center Helpline Jingle Contest** will be conducted to promote the contact center helpline, a reporting mechanism against the violation of the rights of the learners by composing a memorable jingle that acknowledges learners' rights to be protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation, and maltreatment.

 - b. promote awareness that this Department has a venue where learners, teachers, nonteaching personnel, and stakeholders may report incidents of all forms of abuse, bullying, and exploitation; and
 - c. encourage school divisions to showcase the talents of their learners in coming up with a jingle.

1. COMPOSITION

- a. The Jingle must include and emphasize the Learners TeleSafe Contact Center Helpline number 8632-1372, email weprotectlearners@deped.gov.ph, and cellphone number 0945-175-9777.
- b. The Jingle must promote learners' rights to be protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation, and maltreatment.
- c. The Jingle must be lively, easy to understand, sung in Filipino and/or English Language that will emphasize the hotline number, email, cellphone number and the learners' rights. No use of foul, mean, offensive, and rude words.
- d. The time duration for the Jingle must not be more than two (2) minutes.
- e. It must be an original composition made by the learners and maybe through the guidance of a music teacher/coach. Music plagiarism is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.
- f. Any musical instrument may be used as accompaniment.

2. PARTICIPANTS

- a. The contest is open to all learners of public elementary, secondary schools, and community learning centers.
- b. Composers may either be an individual or a group of learners.
- c. One entry per division will qualify for the Regional Level competition.
- d. One entry per region will qualify for the National Level competition.

3. ENTRY FORMAT AND REQUIREMENTS

- a. Jingle Video entries shall be submitted on commonly known video file formats. i.e., mp4, avi, mkv.
- b. Entries must be in High-Quality Video.
- c. Jingle Video file name format should be as follows:

LTCCHJINGLE_SDO_REGION (LTCCHJINGLE_MAKATI_NCR)

- d. Entries must be sent through an email or google forms or a physical copy in a USB flash drive with the following requirements:
 - i. Accomplished Entry Form (see Attachment No. 2).
 - ii. Narrative report on the concept of the jingle.
 - iii. Lyrics of the Jingle.
 - iv. Profile of composers and the music teacher/coach.
 - v. Consent form of the Learner Composers and Coach/es and if Learner Composer is below 18 years of age, the consent of Parent/s or Guardian (see **Attachment No. 3**).

4. ANNOUNCEMENT OF WINNERS

- a. The decision of the judges will be final and irrevocable.
- b. Winners will be announced during the celebration of the National Children's Month in November 2023 and through a DepEd issuance.
- c. The Regional Office (RO) of the winning entry shall be notified through a DepEd memorandum.
- d. The Prices shall be transferred to the Music Teacher or Coach who shall then submit the following, shall they be declared as winners:
 - i. Bank Account No (preferably landbank).
 - ii. Cellphone No.
 - iii. Address
 - iv. School
 - v. Division
 - vi. Region
 - vii. Latest Picture with signature

5. PRICES

Champion/s: P50,000 for the students and a Certificate of Recognition to the School and Regional Office.

First Runner-up: P30,000 for the students and a Certificate of Recognition to the School and Regional Office.

Second Runner-up: P20,000 for the students and a Certificate of Recognition to the School and Regional Office.

Third Runner-up: P10,000 for the students and a Certificate of Recognition to the school and Regional Office.

Consolation Price: P5,000 for every Regional Representative and a Certificate of Participation to the school and Regional Office.
